- #3. Submit the highest qualitytape you can. Crowd noise in a live performance sometimes creates listening problems for the committee.
- #4. The tapes are anonymous to the committee. The identity is only known to the state President. The committee usually consists of 5 or 7 persons representing all levels of the choral program.
- #5. The proposed program is very important. A "maybe" tape with a "high quality" proposed program will probably be sent to the Divisional tape auditioning committee.
- #6. Remember...you not only represent your program, you represent the entire state.

Michael SchwartzkopfHe received a BME and MM from Indiana University and is a candidate for the DMA in choral conducting from the University of Iowa. Mr. Schwartzkipt is presently the Director of Choral and Vocal activities at Mercer University in Macon where he conducts the Mercer University Choir, the Mercer Singers, and the College Street Singers. He has held positions at Minnie Howard Middle School, tenor soloist with the U.S. Army Chorus, assistant to Dr. Allan Ross at Indiana and Dr. Don Moses at Iowa, and conductor of the Brevard Music Center Chorus and Chamber Chorus. Mr. Schwartzkopf has conducted the Macon Civic Chorale and the Middle Georgia Symphony Orchestra. He has served as a festival conductor and adjudicator in Illinois, Indiana and Georgia. Mr. Schwartzkipf has been a tenor soloist in performance at the University of Iowa, Georgia College, Gordon Junior College, and Mercer University of Atlanta. He is an active member of ACDA, GMEA, and MENC.

Michael Anderson -

He is the Director of Choral Music at Tucker High School in Dekalb County where he has been for four years. He is presently serving as the Senior High Organizing Chairman for All State Chorus; the Choral Chairman for the fourth district; on the State Choral Council; and as the Editor for the Georgia Chapter of the American Choral Directors Association. Mr. Anderson has been part of the re-writing team of the Dekalb County Music Curriculum Guide; the Governor's Honors Program in music and the Competency Based Education Committee in Dekalb County.

Mr. Anderson has a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Georgia State University where he is presently finishing his Master of Music Education degree. While at the University he served as the State President of SMENC; the President of the Georgia State University Chapter of SMENC; and sat on the Board of Directors of GMEA. He also served as President of the Choral Council at the University and was the Organizing Manager of the Choral Department under the Direction of Dr. John Haberlen. He was awarded a degree with honors; the Golden Key Award for leadership; the Mortar Board award for leadership and scholarship and named in Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities.

Mr. Anderson was part of the 1978 organizing team for the Southern Division ACDA convention in Atlanta. His groups have most recently appeared at the 1981 GMEA convention in Macon, Georgia in a program co-sponsored with ACDA. He is a life member of ACDA, and a member of MENC and GMEA. He sings with the Atlanta Symphony Chorus; is the former Director of Music at St. Luke Lutheran Church, and has been recently named the Star Teacher at Tucker High School.

FROM: John Hebblethwaite Chairman-Church Choirs Georgia ACDA

I share with you a current interest of mine, litergy as drama. This is not new, and many groups, such as the Covenant Players, have made profound contributions in this area. What's new is the challenge to create these moments ourselves, for our own litergy, in our own arena.

Worship has been characterized as drama for years now, but we're not always sure what that means. What I have done is selected a portion of the liturgy, in this case the Call To Worship, and treated it literally as drama. The difference for the service is that words of doubt, compassion, faith, trust, and love, are coming out of real people standing in our midst, rather than being heard as story-book-like episodes read to us by a worship leader. I commend this effort to you for your use, as well as for encouragement to try your hand - look into your own liturgy - and find ways to make it come alive!

A Call to Worship for Advent I

J. Hebblethwaite Athens, December 1981

(Joseph and Mary move to the chancel area; they appear troubled. Mary is looking away from Joseph as he speaks, but her expression is one of quiet joy.)

JOSEPH: Mary...we've had an honorable courtship...I'm a decent man...I wouldn't ask you to remain loyal to this betrothal if it would cause a scandal...I don't know what...

MARY: (interrupting, but speaking tenderly) It's alright Joseph, we have nothing to hide, nor to fear. God has spoken to me. His words are a great mystery... but my mind is clear...I trust God. (pause) I don't understand all of this, Joseph...but, I know that you and I belong together (taking his hand.)

JOSEPH: Mary, I love you. Go inside, rest. (Mary leaves, Joseph turns his eyes toward heaven and begins to pray)

Oh Lord, it is I, your servant Joseph... I am confused... I don't understand what you are telling us. Lord, speak to my troubled heart; hear the prayer of this faithful one... (repetition of these words)

(Joseph begins to get tired, and finally dozes off as he is praying)

(Silence, Pause. Then the choir begins in whispers, gradually getting louder; some speaking the syllables quickly, some slowly. A flute whole tone melody could accompany.)

CHOIR: Joseph, Joseph, Joseph, etc.)


VOICE: (from balcony, speaks in full tone while choir continues calling Joseph in full stage whisper.)

Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit; she will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins. (Matt. 1:20-21)

CHOIR: Joseph, Joseph, Joseph (gradually softer; simultaneously an organ pedal C begins softly, then crescendes by adding stops; which gives pitch to the choir)

(sung) "Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be called Emmanuel." (Matt. 1:23)

(Organ goes directly into refrain from "O Come, O Come Emmanuel," congregation rises, choir processes.)

MARY

A Call to Worship for the First Sunday in Lent

(Jesus and Mary come to the chancel, and stand at michrophones placed on opposite sides of the chancel, or in the lecturn and pulpit, if a divided chancel. The atmosphere is somewhat sterile, as though many thoughts and feelings are not being said, but are very much there. Neither is particularly emotional, but obviously both are committed to each other. No props, and no gesticulation. Voice and face, speaking across this gap should say it all.)

JESUS: Mother...mother...

MARY: Yes, Son, in here.

JESUS: I completed the last piece in the shop...all the orders are filled...you should have no trouble in maintaining income with our new help.

MARY: You are a fine carpenter. Your father knew you would be. Joseph loved you very much...

JESUS: Yes, I know...

MARY: He also knew that he would have to share you; that you could not be his, alone. It was a great mystery to him, and at times, a great anxiety. He knew you, but then he did not. Only death brought peace to his restlessness.

JESUS: (pause) Mother...I'll be leaving soon...the time has come.

MARY: I know...I've been waiting for this moment. I too have difficulty sharing you. I trust God, but my heart resists His plan. I became His handmaiden in joy, now I must face the other side of that joy...

JESUS: (interrupting) Mother, I love you.


MARY: (pause) I fixed some dates for you; it takes a while to get acquainted in a new place; these will tide you over...

JESUS: Thank you. I'm going to spend a few moments with John; then I'll be on my way....
(pause) Good bye.

(Jesus leaves his microphone, and exits the room.)

(Mary exits slowly as the music begins: "LORD, WHO THROUGHOUT THESE FORTY DAYS")
