JERRY JORDAN Guest Clinician for High School Invitational Choral Festival

Jerry Jordan is Director of Choral Activities at the University of Mississippi. After receiving the BMEd degree with honors from Florida State University, he taught choral music for six years at elementary, junior high, and senior high school levels in Columbus, Georgia. His advanced studies include the MS and EdD degrees from the University of Illinois and additional study at Indiana University, Westminster Choir College, and Juilliard School. Before joining the University of Mississippi faculty, he taught at the University of Illinois where he conducted the Repertory Choir and the University Chamber Ensemble, and served as Coordinator of Choral Music Education. Dr. Jordan has conducted clinics, festivals, and summer music groups throughout the South and Midwest. Choirs under his direction have been invited to perform at state, regional, and national conventions of the American Choral Directors Association.

Under Dr. Jordan's direction, the Ole Miss Concert Singers toured Great Britain in 1984, marking the third subsidized European tour by the Concert Singers in the past four years. While in England they won the choral competition at the Chester Music Festival from among forty-seven choirs representing five countries. The Concert Singers performed last May in New York City at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, and at Lincoln Center with the American Symphony Orchestra. They were invited as one of ten choirs from across the United States after a strenuous audition process. The city of Tours, France, has awarded the Concert Singers a \$4500.00 grant to perform in the International Competition of Choirs to be held in Tours this summer. Having been the only United States Choir to participate, they will be in competition with choirs from every country in western and eastern Europe.

ANN JONES is New President Elect

Ann Howard Jones was elected during Fall balloting to serve as president-elect of the Georgia ACDA Chapter. In July 1985 Michael Anderson resigned as president of the chapter in order to pursue doctoral studies at the University of Colorado. Upon his resignation, the duties of president were assumed by president-elect Beth Brown. As a result of these moves, a vacancy was created in the office of president-elect.

Dr. Jones assumed her position as Assistant Dean of Community Life and Director of Choral Activities at Oglethorpe University in Atlanta in August 1985. She holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Iowa. She has conducted all-state and festival choruses in Georgia, Virginia, Iowa, Nebraska, Kentucky, New Mexico, and Alabama. Dr. Jones is in demand as a leader of seminars and workshops on vocal and choral techniques, conducting, style, and performance practice. She is a member of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra Chorus and Chamber Chorus where she is rehearsal assistant to Robert Shaw.

High School Invitational Choral Festival

The Georgia ACDA Chapter will sponsor a high school invitational choral festival on Saturday, May 3, at Clayton Junior College. The festival is open to all public and private high school choral ensembles. A maximum of five choirs will be selected through audition to participate. Each choir selected will perform a fifteen minute program which will be followed by a fifteen minute clinic by Jerry Jordan, guest clinician.

To be considered for the Georgia ACDA High School Invitational Choral Festival, each choir must submit an application form and a cassette tape representing performances by the choir during each of the past three years. The selections should be of contrasting syles. All directors of selected choirs must be members of ACDA.

A registration fee of \$3.00 per singer will be charged.

Atlanta Show Choir Workshop

The 1986 Atlanta Show Choir Workshop will be held at Georgia State University, July 14-18. The week-long workshop will offer students and teachers the opportunity to develop vocal and dance skills, to become acquainted with new choral literature, and to understand the role of popular music and choreography in the school music curriculum.

Guest artists and faculty will include JOHN JACOBSON, featured singer, dancer, choreographer, and show designer for Walt Disney Productions; JOAN WALTON, accomplished singer, dancer, pianist, and clinician at major workshops throughout the country; JAMES KIMMEL, Vice-President-Choral Marketing at Jenson Publications; and JOHN HABERLEN, Director of Choral Activities at Georgia State University. HARRIS WHEELER and KATHY VANDERBERG will also be featured along with other local clinicians.

Special interest sessions include Basic Choreography, Vical Jazz Techniques, Use of Sound Equipment and Lighting, How to Audition for a Theme Park, and How to Program a Show. High school students who attend the workshop will learn eight to twelve choreographed musical selections. The songs will be presented at an informal concert at the conclusion of the week.
